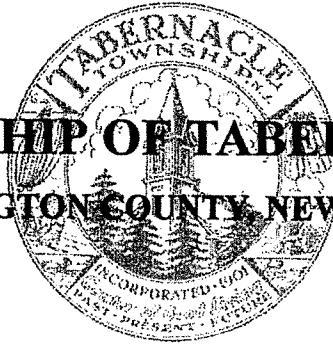

Health and Safety must never be compromised. Employee safety along with the safety of the public is our number one priority. We applaud the JIF's initiative in providing many of the safety resources needed to enhance our local safety efforts, and we hereby declare our support of the JIF's safety programs. We strive to achieve an accident free environment through a health and safety culture built on:

- **TRUST:** We respect each other's opinions and decisions and will follow through on all health and safety concerns
- **CARE:** We approach each day with the determination to care for ourselves, co-workers and the community we serve.
- **KNOWLEDGE:** We seek the education and skills to properly fulfill our responsibilities.
- **COMMUNICATION:** We communicate with each other in a clear, open and honest manner.

Because mutual respect is so important, we cannot tolerate harassment or other forms of discrimination.

1. We have established a Safety Committee that meets at least quarterly.
2. We "Put Safety on the Council Agenda" at least once a year.
3. We establish a motor vehicle fleet safety program.
4. We keep our regulatory training and written programs current.
5. We conduct periodic hazard inspection surveys and Job Site Observations.
6. We encourage supervisors to make a "daily safety contact" with employees.
7. We manage our claims by reporting all claims in a timely manner, offering transitional duty and investigating incidents and near misses.
8. We actively promote and support health and wellness activities.

ICS 402 – Incident Command System Summary for Executives

Course Overview

This course is intended to provide a forum to discuss the agency's strategic and executive level preparedness and response issues and challenges related to WMD/terrorism and other incidents of national significance. It is also intended to serve as a vehicle to share proven strategies and practices as well as enhanced teamwork and coordination among the agency's senior officials responsible for emergency response to a major incident. It will be conducted as a facilitated workshop and will integrate multimedia scenarios and vignettes that highlight the key issues and facilitate discussion

Topics

- Define the role of an Executive relative to the ICS
- Describe the various ways ICS can be applied
- Describe the basic organization of ICS and know the functional responsibilities of the Command and General Staffs
- Describe basic ICS terminology
- Identify the differences between incident/event ICS organizations and the activities accomplished by area Commands, EOC's and MACS
- Describe the major responsibilities of an Executive as related to an incident/event, including the agency administrator briefing and delegation of authority
- Explain the administrative, logistical, financial and reporting implications of large incident/event level considerations operations

Audience

Elected officials, senior executive, senior managers and agency administrators with policy responsibilities, but without specific ICS or Multi-Agency Coordination System function/roles or responsibilities.
